

## **NJ SkillsUSA Championships**

### Safety Display (Revised for 2022)

\*This event is a “NJ only” state sponsored contest- there is no national level competition in this area

#### PURPOSE:

To give one SkillsUSA member an opportunity to depict some aspect of their career training safety instruction in a compact format, using a model, illustration, step-by-step depiction, or other descriptive portrayal.

#### CLOTHING REQUIREMENT:

Official SkillsUSA Attire or Professional Dress.

#### ELIGIBILITY:

Open to all active SkillsUSA members whose name appears on a current membership roster of a New Jersey SkillsUSA Chapter.

#### EQUIPMENT AND MATERIALS

1. Supplied by the technical committee:
  - a. Display Tables
2. Supplied by the contestant:
  - a. All materials and equipment required for the display
  - b. If electricity is required, contestant must have a 25-foot heavy-duty extension cord

#### SCOPE OF THE CONTEST

- An evaluation of a tabletop display that illustrates a particular safety principle or procedure related to their career training.
- Students should be prepared to explain and answer questions about the display.

#### CONTEST GUIDELINES

- A student should be prepared to deliver a brief explanation of why they chose the particular safety principle or procedure.
- The Safety principle or procedure should be clearly and completely demonstrated or illustrated within the display and require no further explanation.
- A 36' by 36' space will be provided for a tabletop display. No part of the display should be taller than 36' from the tabletop.
- The Display must be prepared by the student.
- No hazardous or flammable materials will be allowed.
- Students must bring their own extension cords, power strips, and all other needed supplies.
- Internet access will not be available
- A 3 X 5 file card should be presented to the judges listing:

#### EVALUATION CRITERIA

Displays will be judged according to the following scale.
